CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- **Clean regularly** with a soft microfiber, damp cloth to remove dust and debris. For deeper cleaning, use a mild soap solution and rinse thoroughly with clean water. Avoid abrasive scrubbers.
- **Blot spills immediately** using a clean, dry cloth to prevent staining or moisture damage.
- **Outdoor exposure is expected** teak naturally weathers and will develop a silver-gray patina over time. This aesthetic change does not affect the wood's strength or durability.
- **Avoid harsh chemicals**, including bleach, ammonia-based cleaners, and furniture polish, as they may damage the finish.
- **Use protective pads** indoors under furniture legs, and avoid placing outdoor teak directly on wet or damp surfaces for extended periods.
- **Cover when not in use** outdoors, use breathable covers to protect from moisture, dirt, and UV exposure.
- **Store during extreme weather** if possible, move teak furniture indoors or under shelter during heavy rain or snow.
- **Expect natural movement**, teak may expand or contract slightly with temperature and humidity changes. Small cracks or separations are normal and part of the wood's character.
